Have you ever wondered how pennies or to the coining press. Here, the coins are quarters are made? The United States Mint makes millions of coins daily. People and machines work together to manufacture coins that we use every day.

First, circles are punched from large strips of metal that are about 13 inches by 1,500 feet. This is called blanking. Any leftover metal is chopped and recycled. Those blanks are then heated in a furnace to soften them, then they are washed and dried.

Next, the coins go through an upsetting mill, which raises the rim around the edges.

An automatic counting machine then counts the coins and puts them into large bags. Trucks will then take the new coins to banks for everyone to use. Pretty neat!
